

Transition Planning – What Comes Next? Are We Ready?

My Pastoral Theology professor in seminary, Charlie Cook, said at the outset of the class that one of the most important things an incoming rector or vicar could do for his or her congregation was to prepare the parish for their eventual departure. It was reminiscent of the admonishment I heard long ago as a Boy Scout to “leave the campground better than you found it.” I took both to heart, and have kept them in mind as part of the work God gave me to do here at St. Christopher’s. Fortunately, I’ve had lots of help, for which I am most appreciative!

In the corporate and military worlds, getting ready for changes in leadership is often called “Succession Planning”, and often involves grooming up-an-coming individuals to take on greater responsibility, so that they can take over for the ones leaving or retiring. In the church, it is referred to as “Transition Planning” – with the idea in mind that change will come, no matter how much we might want to keep the status quo, and that we ought to make the best of change when it inevitably comes.

The Vestry, as the leadership team of the parish that is in place even as rectors come and go, has entered into transition planning for the day that I retire from full-time ministry and will have to absent myself from St. Christopher’s. I am pleased to say that Vestry has embraced the concept, and has taken some concrete steps to prepare for the day when it comes. Among those steps is setting aside money each month to build up funds to help defray some of the costs of a search for a new rector and the relocation expenses that might be incurred when a new rector is called.

The current discernment process that will determine whether or not we should enter into a Capital Campaign is also critical to transition planning, in the sense that the input you provide helps define our vision and priorities as a parish – and is key to developing an updated Parish Profile that is part of the search process.

The inevitable question is, “When will I retire?” At this point in time, I envision retiring after my 75th birthday, in January of 2019. That is contingent upon a number of factors, assuming my health continues to be good, the annual approval of the Bishop to continue in full-time ministry here, and the approval and concurrence of the Vestry. Although the ultimate retirement date could change, transition planning should revolve around the January 2019 time frame.

I’m by no means ready to sing my swan song – but having a retirement date in mind keeps us all on track for the next phase of life at St. Christopher’s. We have a lot more to do together in the next year-and-a-half to build up the Body of Christ in our little niche of Sun City.

Planificación para la Transición - ¿Qué Viene Después? ¿Estamos listos?

Mi profesor de Teología Pastoral en el seminario, Charlie Cook, dijo al principio de la clase que una de las cosas más importantes que un rector o vicario podría hacer por su congregación era preparar a la parroquia para su salida eventual. Era una reminiscencia de la amonestación que escuché hace mucho tiempo como un *Boy Scout* para “dejar el campamento mejor que usted lo encontró.” Tomé ambos a corazón, y los he tenido en mente como parte de la obra que Dios me dio para hacer aquí en San Cristóbal. Afortunadamente, he tenido mucha ayuda, ¡por lo que estoy muy agradecido!

En los mundos corporativos y militares, prepararse para los cambios en el liderazgo es a menudo llamado “Planificación para la Sucesión”, y implica preparar a los individuos con gran talento para asumir mayor responsabilidad, para que puedan asumir la posición de los que salen o se retiran. En la iglesia se refiere a como “Planificación para la Transición”, con la idea de que el cambio vendrá, no importa cuánto queramos mantener el statu quo, y que debemos hacer lo mejor del cambio cuando inevitablemente proviene.

El Vestry (La Junta Parroquial), como el equipo de liderazgo de la parroquia que está en su lugar, incluso como rectores van y vienen, ha entrado en la planificación para la transición para el día que me retiro del ministerio a tiempo completo y tendré que ausentarme de San Cristóbal. Me complace decir que la Junta Parroquial ha adoptado el concepto, y ha tomado algunos pasos concretos para prepararse para el día en que llegue. Entre esos pasos están reservando dinero cada mes para acumular fondos para ayudar a sufragar algunos de los costos de una búsqueda para un nuevo rector, y los gastos de reubicación que podrían incurrir cuando se llama un nuevo rector.

El proceso actual de discernimiento que determinará si debemos o no entrar en una Campaña de Capital es también crítico para la planificación para la transición, en el sentido de que las ideas que ustedes proporcionan ayudan a definir nuestra visión y prioridades como parroquia – y es clave para desarrollar el Perfil Parroquial que forma parte del proceso de búsqueda.

La pregunta inevitable es: “¿Cuándo me jubilaré?” En este momento, imagino que me jubilaré después de cumplir 75 años, en enero de 2019. Eso depende de una serie de factores, suponiendo que mi salud continúa siendo buena, la aprobación del Obispo para continuar en el ministerio de tiempo completo aquí, y la aprobación y la concurrencia de la Junta Parroquial. Aunque la definitiva fecha de jubilación podría cambiar, la planificación de la transición debería girar alrededor del calendario de enero de 2019.

Estoy de ninguna manera listo para cantar mi “canción de cisne” - pero tener una fecha de retiro en mente nos mantiene a todos en la pista para la próxima fase de la vida en San Cristóbal. Tenemos mucho más que hacer juntos en el próximo año y medio para edificar el Cuerpo de Cristo en nuestro pequeño nicho de Sun City.

Killy Balabanis and myself are facilitators for the Workbench. We have had a Lutheran Missionary visit our class during March and April from whom we learned a great deal. Surprisingly, he told us that what we are doing is badly needed. We need to have the opportunity to express our doubts, fears, joys and wonders without being told we are wrong to think or feel the way we do. Many questions we have had as a youngster we still have as an adult concerning Jesus, God and The Holy Spirit. Care to share them with us? We don't offer answers. We simply listen to one another and attempt to connect to each lesson, each Tuesday at 10:30...over at noon.



ST. CHRISTOPHER'S CHURCH SIGNAGE GOES DIGITAL!!

The signs in front of St. Christopher's church on Peoria Avenue are instrumental in reaching out to people in our community about our service times, ministries and activities in our worship and outreach.


St. Christopher's members had been talking since 2009 about the possibility of installing an electronic sign to replace and update the monument and portable signs along Peoria Avenue. When the Welcome Ministry was formed in early 2016, a committee was established to get information, prices and bids from various sign companies.

The committee and Vestry members worked and recommended, a resolution was recommended and approved by the Vestry on April 24, 2017 to engage Precise Signs to erect a new digital LED sign to replace the monument and portable signs at the corner of 103rd and Peoria Avenues. Currently, Precise Signs has completed the necessary structural engineering work and the permit was submitted to Maricopa County in late May. Once the permit is granted, the electronic portion will be We hope to have the sign installed in late July. We will be able to schedule our messages to coincide with our activities and notices easily by computer without anyone going outside to manually change the letters. St. Christopher's has moved into the electronic age!


