TAI CHI:

Balance in

Movement

Would you like to

improve your balance, increase energy and



stamina, improve muscle strength, reduce stress, lower your blood pressure and increase your feeling of well-being? Tai Chi, when practiced regularly, may help you obtain these benefits.

Tai Chi combines slow, gentle movements and stretches with deep breathing and relaxation in a low-impact form of exercise. No special equipment is necessary; just wear loose, comfortable clothing and flat shoes.


Two classes will be offered in the parish hall on Wednesdays starting September 14th and continuing through November.

Beginning at 10:00 a.m. will be <u>Tai Chi Essentials</u>, based on five of the postures from the Yang style form using the tai chi techniques in gentle, flowing exercises. You may want to try this if you have never taken tai chi before.

At 11:00 a.m. if you want to try a more advanced exercise, the <u>Tai Chi Yang Style Form</u>, will be held consisting of the first 15 postures of the form.

Message from Fr. Peter

Where Do You Live? Where Do You Want to Live? Scarcity or Abundance?

One of my mentor priests often lamented that we live in a "Kingdom of Stuff" that binds us to material things and isolates us from one another. He'd go on to

rail against the evils of living in gated or age-restricted communities, and I sometimes thought that I should feel guilty about living in a community that was <u>both</u> gated and age-restricted. I've since come to the realization that why and how we do things is every bit as important as what we do. Our ability to share the Good News of Jesus Christ in our lives, and with those we encounter in those lives, is not dictated by the street on which we live, our income, or our age. It is much more about our attitudes, the way we set our priorities, and what drives our choices.

When it comes right down to it, we can choose to live in one of two places: **The Kingdom of Scarcity**, or **The Kingdom of Abundance**. And we can move from one kingdom to the other – without even changing our street address!

The material world in which we live – the "Kingdom of Stuff" as my mentor would say – is one that constantly bombards us with messages that tell us there is "not enough to go around", that the next calamity is around the corner, and we'd better gather up as much as we can now so we don't run out. It also tells us that more is better and we somehow are entitled to the best of everything, without regarding the needs of others. It is a "Me First" kingdom that reminds me of the bumper sticker that reads: "HE WHO DIES WITH THE MOST TOYS WINS." It is based on fear and insufficiency.

There is another kingdom, God's Kingdom, that is one of Abundance. Scripture reminds us time and time again in both the Old and New Testaments, that God provides for our needs, and that His love is abundant. In Jesus's death and resurrection, we are promised life – and not just ordinary life, but abundant life. This is not the carefree life that some preachers of the "Prosperity Gospel" proclaim, nor does it mean that all we have to do is pray in earnest and our wishes will be granted. It's not that easy. God's economy is very different than the economy of the world.

So What?


We've spent a good deal of time since Pentecost hearing from the Gospel according to Luke. If there is a central theme that should resonate with us as members of the Body of Christ, it is to have faith, be transformed by that faith, and put it into practice.

When we live in a mindset of scarcity, we respond to challenges reactively –patching things as they break, and covering them up with Band-Aids, fearing the next crisis. When we live in a mindset of abundance, we respond proactively – strengthening things before they break and looking for long-term solutions. Scarcity drives us to look inwardly and focus on what we can't (or dare not) do. It's an inward and downward spiral. Abundance encourages us to look upward and outward beyond ourselves, see opportunities to share the Good News, and trust that God will help us make it possible.

I am convinced that it takes just as much effort to live one's life from the perspective of scarcity as it does from that of abundance. The difference in the outcome, however, is enormous! There are possibilities to explore, and great hope for the future of our parish, if we are willing to shift our paradigm from scarcity to abundance. I invite you to dare to dream, seek God's guidance, and step out in faith. As we are reminded in Philippians 4:13: "I can do all things through Him who strengthens me."

¿Dónde Vives? ¿Dónde Quieres Vivir? ¿Escasez o Abundancia?

Uno de mis mentores a menudo se lamentaba de que vivimos en un "Reino de Cosas" que nos une a las cosas materiales y nos aísla unos a los otros. Denunció los males de vivir en comunidades cerradas o comunidades con restricción de edad, y a veces pensé que debería sentirme culpable por vivir en una comunidad que fue a la vez cerrada y con restricciones de edad. Desde entonces he llegado a la conclusión de que por qué y cómo hacemos las cosas es tan importante como lo que hacemos. Nuestra capacidad de compartir las Buenas Nuevas de Jesucristo en nuestras vidas, y con los que nos encontramos en esas vidas, no está dictada por la calle donde vivimos, nuestros ingresos, o nuestra edad. Se trata mucho más acerca de nuestras actitudes, la for-

ma en que establecemos nuestras prioridades, y lo que impulsa nuestras decisiones.

Cuando se trata, a fin de cuentas, podemos elegir vivir en uno de dos lugares: El Reino de Escasez, o El Reino de la Abundancia. Y podemos pasar de un reino a otro - ¡sin ni siquiera cambiar nuestra dirección de la calle!

El mundo material en el que vivimos - el "Reino de las Cosas", como diría mi maestro - es uno que nos bombardea constantemente con mensajes que nos dicen "no hay suficiente para todos", que la próxima calamidad es a la vuelta de la esquina, y será mejor que recogemos tanto como podemos ahora para que no nos falte. También nos dice que más es mejor y que de alguna manera tenemos derecho a lo mejor de todo, sin tener en cuenta las necesidades de los demás. Es un reino de "yo primero" que me recuerda a la pegatina de parachoques que dice lo siguiente: "ÉL QUE MUERE CON LOS MÁS JUGUETES GANA". Se basa en el miedo y la insuficiencia.

Hay otro reino, el Reino de Dios, que es uno de Abundancia. La Escritura nos recuerda una y otra vez tanto en el Antiguo como el Nuevo Testamento, que Dios provee para nuestras necesidades, y que su amor es abundante. En la muerte y resurrección de Jesús, se nos promete la vida - y no sólo la vida ordinaria, pero la vida abundante. Esta no es la vida sin preocupaciones de que algunos predicadores del "evangelio de la prosperidad" proclaman, ni tampoco significa que todo lo que tenemos que hacer es rezar en serio y se otorgarán nuestros deseos. No es tan fácil. La economía de Dios es muy diferente de la economía del mundo.

¿Y Qué Importa?

Hemos pasado una buena cantidad de tiempo desde el Día de Pentecostés escuchando lecturas del Evangelio según San Lucas. Si hay un tema central que debe resonar con nosotros como miembros del Cuerpo de Cristo, es que debemos tener fe, ser transformados por esa fe, y ponerla en práctica.

Cuando vivimos en una mentalidad de escasez, respondemos a los retos de forma reactiva - reparando cosas que se rompen, y cubriéndolos con curitas, temiendo la próxima crisis. Cuando vivimos en una mentalidad de abundancia, respondemos de manera proactiva - fortaleciendo las cosas antes de romper y en busca de soluciones a largo plazo. La escasez nos impulsa a mirar hacia dentro y nos centramos en lo que no podemos (o no nos atrevemos a) hacer. Es una espiral hacia adentro y hacia abajo. Abundancia nos anima a mirar hacia arriba y hacia fuera más allá de nosotros mismos, ver las oportunidades de compartir las Buenas Nuevas, y confiar en que Dios nos ayudará a hacer esto posible.

Estoy convencido de que se necesita la misma cantidad de esfuerzo para vivir la vida desde el punto de vista de la escasez como desde la perspectiva de la abundancia. La diferencia en el resultado, sin embargo, ¡es enorme! Hay posibilidades para explorar y una gran esperanza para el futuro de nuestra parroquia, si estamos dispuestos a cambiar nuestro paradigma desde la escasez a la abundancia. Los invito a que se atreven a soñar, buscar la guía Dios, y tomar un paso adelante en fe. Como se nos recuerda en Filipenses 4:13: "Todo lo puedo en Cristo que me fortalece."

God Is With Us, a 5-week study of the lectionary readings for Advent and Christmas.


By following the lectionary, our bible study and prayers will be in tune with our Sunday




